The Ball is the social highlight of the College Year. The students who attend have a great time.

It is a school function and we look after it carefully. There are rules for our Ball that we have developed over time to ensure that it is great evening for everybody.

The rules are set out in an agreement that everyone must sign before they are sold tickets. These are the rules:-

1. Only students in Year 11, 12 or 13 may attend the Ball.
2. Partners may be invited by Year 12 & 13 students only. Partners must observe the rules of the Ball.
3. Travel to and from the Ball will only be by school organized bus.
4. No one is permitted to stay in the city after the Ball.
5. There will be breath checks before boarding the buses.
6. Anyone who is discovered to have consumed alcohol before the Ball will not be allowed on the bus and cannot attend the Ball.
7. The venue will check for alcohol at the door. Anyone in possession of alcohol will be sent home. A breach of this rule also puts in jeopardy future College Balls.
8. The Ball is a no smoking event.
9. There is no school approved after Ball function anywhere.
10. In any case, there is to be no after Ball function in the city under any circumstances at all.
11. Every ticket purchased has to be for a named person.
12. Admission to the Ball is by ticket only and requires the person named as purchasing the ticket to hold the ticket.
13. Each student attending the Ball must arrive at school before the departure of the bus. If you miss the bus there is no admission to the Ball.
14. There is no leaving the Ball venue during the Ball.
15. The school reserves the right to refuse any person a ticket.
