Teachers are monitoring the situation at school and are referring any students of concern to the school Health Centre where Jeanie Nasey checks them thoroughly.

We would like to thank parents who are watching their children and keeping those who are ill at home. Please continue to do this and please ring the absences into school in the morning.

The country has moved from a containment strategy to a 'manage it' strategy. This means that there is little likelihood that the school will have to close. We still expect there to be quite a few cases of flu among the school community so keeping hygiene practices up and keeping sick students at home will be very important for the rest of the year.

As we get closer to the end of the school year assignment deadlines and examinations become more and more important. Please make sure the school knows if your child is home ill so that we can help manage important deadlines and examination entries. Please remember that medical certificates will be needed for any students who cannot sit NZQA examinations.

Prevention is still the Key

- **Cover your nose and mouth when you cough or sneeze.**
- **Don't cough or sneeze in to your hands without washing them immediately.**
- **Wash your hands regularly - at least 20 seconds with soap and water.**
- **Don't come to school if you have a cold or the flu.**
- **Consider staying home for one week after international travel.**

The Rodney and South Kaipara Districts are rapidly growing areas of Auckland in which a wide range of businesses are being established. As well as the horticulture and agriculture sectors there are many light industries, innovative technology industries and service sector businesses.

This expo will show students, parents and the community what education, training and employment opportunities exist right on our doorstep.

The expo has been designed to be of interest to the wider community as well as parents and their children. There are 60 exhibitors from Universities, Polytechs, Private Institutions, Industry Training Organisations and local community organisations attending along with the Navy, Airforce, Army and Police. St John Ambulance will be on site explaining pathways into this type of work. As well, the Kaipara Coast Guard boat will be here looking for volunteers and junior cadets.

Students, parents and any interested people from the community will be able to book into specific Mini Lectures that will be running from 12.30 pm until 6.00 pm. The list of topics is below. Tickets are free but are limited to 35 seats for each lecture. They can be picked up from the front office of the school during working hours prior to next Thursday.

The Expo will be run at the same time as a parent-teacher evening so that there is an opportunity for parents to become involved in career discussions with their children and direct with the exhibitors themselves.

The Expo opens to the public at midday and runs until 7.00 pm in the evening. Food in the form of hangi, \$10.00 (out at approx 3.45 pm), and sausage sizzle will keep the hunger pangs away, while at the same time supporting community fundraising projects.
