## Good Win for 1st XV

On Saturday the Kaipara College Mitre 10 1st XV Rugby team scored a meritorious victory over Rangitoto's 1st XV. In a close-fought match, the local boys held out for a tremendous 14-12 victory over the Shore lads from one of the biggest schools in New Zealand.

Rangitoto started the game very well, with their forwards running hard and straight, to lead 12 - 0 after fifteen minutes. Despite these early set-backs the Kaipara forwards showed a lot of resolve to gradually turn the tide. They performed heroically on defence as Rangitoto stuck to their forward-orientated game for the rest of the first half, before slowly starting to gain control of the contact area.

In the second half the Kaipara forwards, including Cole Taylor, Kareem Richards, Daryl Moore, Dillon O'Leary and Player of the Day number 8 John-Paul Nehemia, started dominating, allowing strong running inside-centre Duke Hemana to threaten, running excellent lines and frequently

making 20 - 30 metre gains on his hit-ups. Captain and 1st five-eight Billy May capitalised when he took the initiative and a quick tap-kick fifteen metres out from the Rangitoto try-line, breaking three tackles to score a try under the posts, which he also converted. Two minutes later the Kaipara forwards again worked their way back down to the Rangitoto try line. After a great hit up from prop Cameron McDonald, quick ball was released to Billy May who delivered a perfect short ball to the rampaging Hemana who broke past several would-be tacklers to dot down under the sticks for Kaipara's second try. Billy May converted to put Kaipara into the lead, a lead which they held to the final whistle, despite Rangitoto's final flourish, which included a couple of failed penalty attempts. In the backs Jordan Makara and Tre Sinisa-Stil also had strong games. Coach Dean Bristow was ecstatic after the game, especially with the way the team held strong under pressure to secure the team's first win over Rangitoto since 2004.
