“We All Fall Down” a Hit

In *We All Fall Down* the legend of Oedipus unfolds through the eyes of his two young daughters, whose suffering remains untold in the Sophocles tragedy.

The play was first performed in 2007 as part of the University of Auckland postgraduate Drama Series. Director Naomi Bartlett has developed her work for schools by working with Kaipara Drama students. They have participated with Naomi in further developing the script, prior to it being made more widely available. “Working with Kaipara College on this project has been a very rewarding experience for me. The students’ unwavering enthusiasm and commitment over the last twelve weeks is a credit to the school and to their own development as actors,” she said. Drama teacher Melody Mendonza has also enjoyed working with Naomi and has seen the benefit to the students’ understanding of performance drama.

Last night was the first of a two night season. “It was an impressive, sophisticated performance,” said English teacher, Jill Crew. “The students produced a compelling and gripping portrayal of children being drawn tragically into adults’ troubles.” She was very pleased to see the high quality of the performance especially on a first night.
